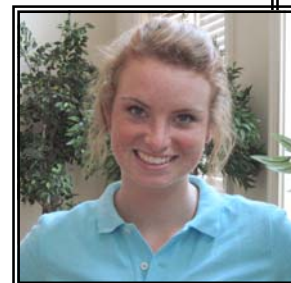

This person is generally appointed by the school Principal. Sometimes, these are called "Anchor Sponsors." The Anchor Coordinator is a member of the Pilot Club that sponsors the Anchor Club. This person is appointed by the Pilot Club President and is the liaison between the Pilot Club and the Anchor Club. Both of these people are critical to the success of any Anchor Club. They need to communicate constantly. It would be great if the Anchor Advisor could attend Pilot Club meetings and if the Anchor Coordinator could attend Anchor Club meetings. It is also good to have some joint Anchor/Pilot projects and social events throughout the year. It is important that we have your current "Anchor Advisor" and "Anchor Coordinator" information so the proper people can receive the newsletters and other correspondence to keep you updated.

"Freedom's Foundation"

From District Anchor Coordinator Lynda...



Freedom's Foundation is a program sponsored by Pilot International where participants attend leadership and citizenship seminars, learn about the free enterprise system and tour historic Philadelphia and Valley Forge.

It will be held February 24-27, 2011. Each Anchor Club may send one or more delegates. Let's try to have a great attendance this year! Several of your District Anchor officers plan to attend and I will be there, too, so if an adult from your school cannot attend, you can join us. If you need me to talk to your school principal or counselor, I will. This is a once-in-a-lifetime experience and you will be so glad you went.

A brochure is attached and gives a schedule of events and topics. You will need to arrive at Philadelphia International Airport Thursday by 4 or so and should plan your return flight after 2 pm on Sunday. Talk about Freedom's Foundation in your Anchor Club meetings and get as excited as I am to attend.

The base price includes your shuttle from the Philadelphia airport, lodging for three nights, food from arrival to departure, tours, speakers and workshops. Dress as you would for school and church. You may want to bring swaps (pins or patches of your area or something from your school) to exchange with other participants and some spending money for snacks or souvenirs. Many Pilot Clubs put in their budget a certain amount to support their Anchors in attending Freedom's Foundation. Ask your sponsoring Pilot Club if they have any money to support you in this regard. If not, start fundraising now to send one or more Anchors from your club. And whoever goes, remember to come back and share what you learned with your entire Anchor Club.

His story really left a big impression on me and the other Anchors.

Overall, the convention was amazing and the people and information that I learned was great. It's funny because

when my mom and I were planning this trip she really didn't know much about the Pilot organization. Well, right before we went there she became a new member and now, because of the great sense of purpose shared by the members at the convention, my grandmother is going to join. I am looking forward to bringing back the enthusiasm shared to my local chapter.

About Pilot International and Anchors

Pilot International was founded and chartered in 1921 as an international service organization. The river boat pilots of the early 1900s are the inspiration for the name. These pilots were admired for their ability to steer a "true course" through challenging conditions and obstacles.

Today, Pilot International has approximately 500 clubs and more than 25,000 adult and youth members. Since 1991, the organization's service focus has been helping persons with brain-related disorders and disabilities through education, volunteerism, and financial support.

About Anchor Clubs

Since it was chartered October, 1921, Pilot Clubs have undertaken a great deal of service projects involving young people and their needs. At the 1952 convention PI adopted this international project of sponsoring ANCHOR CLUBS for adolescent girls in high schools. Anchor is now over 50 years old and is made up of over 10,000 male and female students in nearly 300 clubs throughout the U.S., Bahamas, and Japan. Anchor Clubs take many forms-some are affiliated with schools; some are not. Some are all female; some are co-ed. Some are large; some are small. But regardless of affiliation, size, composition or service project, one thing is true for all Anchors- they exist to provide volunteer service to those in need.

About the Freedom's Foundation

The Freedom's Foundation at Valley Forge, founded in 1949, celebrates the United States Constitution and the Bill of Rights and their relevance to our daily lives. Our goal is to educate and inspire students and their teachers with the words, meaning and emotion that these founding documents convey, utilizing interactive programs that explore our history and debates that focus on Constitutional concepts in this changing world.



Each year, more than 3,000 elementary and secondary school students from across the country visit the historic Valley Forge campus to learn about America. The Foundation immerses students in a living history educational experience that engages them in topics critical to the future of freedom.

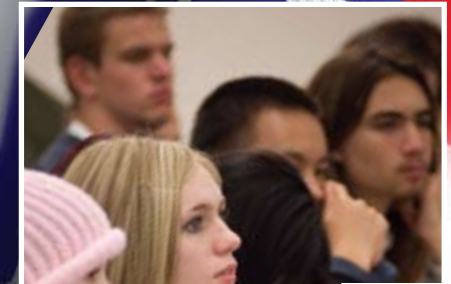
