

PARLIAMENTARIAN MESSAGE

Well it's that time of year again! Time for electing officers, making plans for a New Year and editing and/or changing bylaws and standing rules. To expedite the process a quick look at Parliamentary Procedure might be helpful.

Simply stated, parliamentary procedure is the process of helping a group efficiently agree on what they want to do and how they want to go about it. So here are a few reminders:

1. Read and understand the "rules" for your specific group's meeting.
2. Study the materials sent out before the meeting and ask a knowledgeable person if there is something you don't understand.
3. Listen to instructions and discussions with an open mind and a desire to achieve the best outcome for everyone in the group.
4. All attendees (both delegates and non-delegates) are allowed to speak on issues within the confines of the rules which usually limit time to speak and number of times a member can speak on the same issue.

\*\*\*One thing which helps efficiency is to remember that if someone else has already made the point you were going to make, you don't need to do it again!

\*\*\*Any member can speak, but ONLY delegates can vote.

5. At convention if you want to speak, please go to a microphone and clearly state your name and your club's name so that the secretary may correctly have the information for the official records.

My wish for you all is a season of happy and peaceful and productive planning. The success of our organization comes from our membership's diversity. When we come together in friendship we can accomplish anything we set our minds to.
